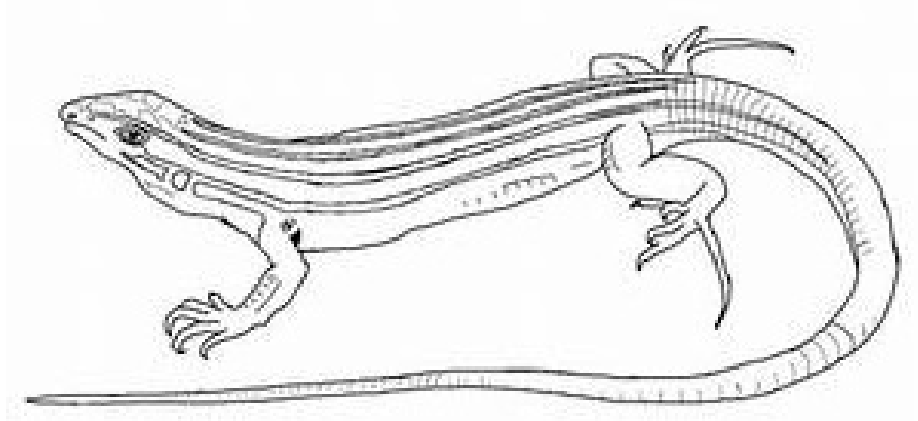
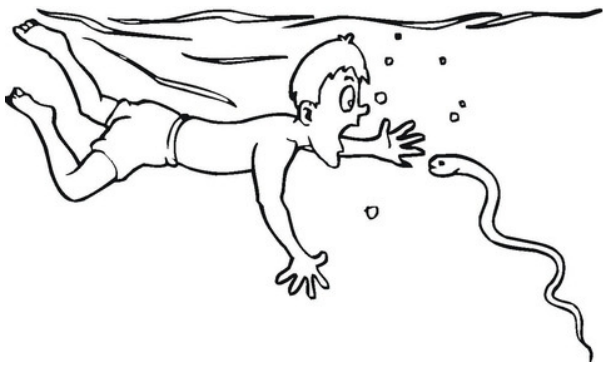


Reptiles

The Five-Lined Skink is unique to our area in The Land Between where the granite meets the limestone. It is Ontario's only lizard.

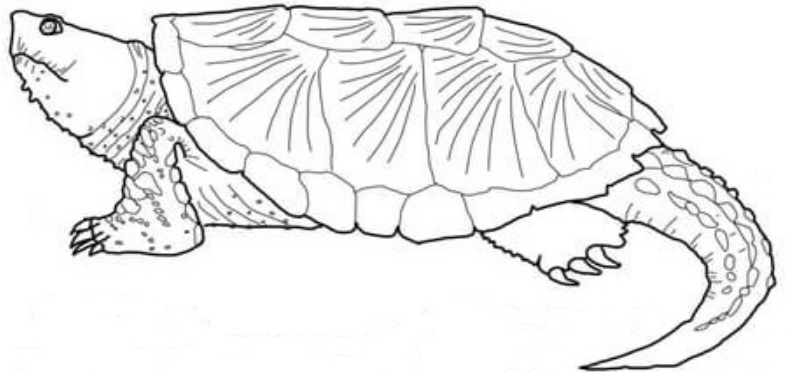


Snakes in our area do not have venom so are not harmful. Like most wild creatures, they prefer to not be near humans, so if you see one, just let it pass by.



Common snakes in our area are: Fox, Milk, Ribbon and Northern Water.

Turtles help keep our lake clean so that we can swim. The snapping turtle only snaps on land not in the water. It does this to protect itself because it can't hide in its shell like other turtles.



We have 8 species of turtles that are native to Ontario, but you're most likely to see painted and snapping turtles.
