Lake Water Quality Testing Report

Environmental Committee Member: Doug Eddy

Discussion: Harvey Lakeland Estates developing, need to make contact as they are affecting our water quality with increased use. Bruce advised that area was auctioned off Little Bald docking system resulting in many big boats, we need to contact them to pay dues

Susan Isles complained about float plane leaking oil into the water system

Doug thanked Colin Hoag for his hard work in the past, Bruce and Doug took over, new this year and still in the learning curve. It takes them approximately 40 minutes to collect the water samples. Doug suggested changing the water testing area for next year. Testing is done every two weeks, weekly during busy season. Samples submitted within 24 hours.

E. Coli testing:

Highest results are in Saunders Bay for e. Coli on one particular result only, overall highest is Catalina Bay & Richards Bay which are shallow, narrow bays, high density residence, weed growth, wildlife, geese, north east shores, prevailing winds take things there. Catalina Bay however is much reduced from last years results.

Water clarity good:

Weeds less this year due to colder winter.

Phosphorus results:

which relate back to septic, fertilizer, and naturally from weeds

Proposed budget of maximum \$600.00 for food & speakers

The winter carnival in 2013 was a spur of the moment event and was well received by all that attended. Its cost was approximately \$300.00 and we have decided to do this again on the family day long weekend on Saturday February 14, 2015. Kim & Glenn have kindly offered to host it again. There will be a chilli cook off, skating, curling, and other fun winter activities.

Proposed budget of maximum \$400.00

We are working on creating a scavenger hunt regatta to be held on Saturday August 1, 2015. We would need 4-5 cottages to volunteer to host. Participants of all ages would be encouraged and they would be expected to use small watercraft, paddle boats, canoes, and kayaks to participate. At each cottage there would be games for all ages, and minimal snack type food. They would need to find something for their scavenger hunt at each location and in the end there would be prizes for the first to complete the hunt and prizes for each activity at each cottage.

<u>Proposed budget of maximum \$50.00 for each cottage participating towards food & game materials and additional \$300.00 for T-shirts & prizes</u>

In addition we are in the process of getting an interactive tab created on the website so that likeminded people can get together, i.e. if you need a 4th for golf, if you have the children up and you want to see if there are any similar aged on the lake, etc.

Q. high water issue of last spring:

A. Bruce asked about this at all candidates meeting, Rick Aube was only candidate who wanted to address it. Bruce is taking that on. About 4-5 years ago computer system to determine when the logs come out, money invested in computer system, man made not a natural problem. Not working. Last spring they took logs out of Mississauga dam, when they weren't flooding above, first priority navigation system
